

IEEE Computer Society DIGITAL LIBRARY SUBSCRIBER AGREEMENT

The IEEE Computer Society Digital Library (CSDL), consisting of an electronic archive of journals and conference proceedings owned and published by IEEE, and all other text and graphics to which access is provided by IEEE CS according to the terms of this Agreement, as may be supplemented or modified from time to time by or on behalf of IEEE CS, is a service of the IEEE Computer Society available to IEEE Computer Society Members.

Section 1. How Do I Register?

By completing the registration process and agreeing to the terms of this Agreement, you become a subscriber (“Subscriber”) to the CSDL. This Agreement governs all use of the CSDL and access to the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content, as defined below. This is the entire Agreement between IEEE Computer Society and Subscriber relating to the CSDL.

PLEASE READ THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT
CAREFULLY AND ACKNOWLEDGE YOUR UNDERSTANDING AND ACCEPTANCE BY
SELECTING THE **I AGREE** BUTTON BELOW.

IN ORDER TO BE AND REMAIN A SUBSCRIBER AND PREVENT
SUSPENSION OF YOUR ACCESS TO THE CSDL OR TERMINATION OF THIS
AGREEMENT (SEE SECTION 10), YOU MUST BE AN IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY
MEMBER, AS DEFINED BELOW, AT ALL TIMES DURING THE TERM OF THIS
AGREEMENT. BY SELECTING THE **I AGREE** BUTTON BELOW, YOU AGREE TO
SUBSCRIBE TO THE CSDL AND PAY ALL FEES DUE HEREUNDER. If you do not agree
with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, select the CANCEL button or click your browser’s
back button and access will not be provided to the CSDL. By selecting **I AGREE** , you agree to be
bound by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 2. Changes to This Agreement.

(a) IEEE Computer Society may at any time, amend this Agreement or modify the features, services and functions available to Subscriber or the fees charged for use of the CSDL. Any amended Agreement will be made available online at <http://www.computer.org/publications/dlib/> and will be effective immediately upon posting by IEEE Computer Society. By acknowledging acceptance of the amended Agreement or by using the CSDL after any amendment by IEEE Computer Society, you agree to be bound by the Agreement, as amended. If any amended Agreement during your Initial Term or Renewal term implements an increase in the fees set forth in Section 5 or a decrease in the number of Documents, as defined below, that you may access per month as set forth in Section 4(a), you may terminate the Agreement and any access to the CSDL as provided in Section 10(d)(i).

(b) IEEE Computer Society reserves the right to implement Digital Rights Management (DRM) technology to protect the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content and ensure that Documents are used in compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

DRM technology may encrypt the contents of Documents and prevent Subscriber from using Documents except in the ways expressly authorized under this Agreement.

Section 3. What Our Terms Mean.

“Document” means the full-text PDF, HTML, or XML of a single journal paper, transaction paper, magazine article or conference paper available in the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content.

“Effective Date” means the day the Subscriber completes the registration process set forth in this Agreement.

“IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content” means the IEEE Computer Society journals, transactions, magazines and conference proceedings that are available through IEEE Computer Society Digital Library.

“IEEE Computer Society Member” means a paid-up member of the IEEE Computer Society, including student and life members, authenticated by IEEE Computer Society as eligible to subscribe to and access the CSDL. Selected other society members may also be eligible to subscribe to and access selected periodicals and are liable under this agreement to the same extent as IEEE Computer Society members. “IEEE Web Account” means the IEEE Member username and password on file with IEEE for accessing IEEE online products and services, including the CSDL. Section 4. Description of the CSDL Product.

(a) **What do I Get?** The CSDL is a subscription product that provides the Subscriber access to the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content. Members may choose full CSDL access or subscription access to individual periodical titles. Links to Documents accessed by Subscriber may be stored as desired.

Section 5. Fees.

(a) . Subscription fees are variable. See <http://www.computer.org/subscribe/> for details. Subscriber will be charged the appropriate fees regardless of whether Subscriber uses the CSDL.

(b) Subscriber shall be solely responsible for all costs associated with establishing access to and use of the CSDL, and any applicable sales, use, ad valorem or other taxes for which Subscriber is responsible.

(c) Subscriber is responsible for all access to and use of the CSDL by means of Subscriber’s IEEE Web Account, even if Subscriber did not know of or authorize such access and use.

Section 6. Grant of License.

IEEE Computer Society grants Subscriber a non-exclusive, non-transferable, license to access the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content and to use any Documents accessed from the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

Section 7. What We Authorize You To Do And What We Ask You Not To Do.

(a) Subscriber is authorized to do the following:

(i) search and view the content of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(ii) download Documents as permitted by Section 4 for individual use;

(iii) assemble and distribute links that point to the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(iv) print individual Documents from the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content for individual use;

(v) make a reasonable number of photocopies of a Document for individual use

(b) Notwithstanding any of the terms of subparagraph (a) of this section, Subscriber shall not:

(i) allow anyone other than Subscriber to use the CSDL or access the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(ii) display or otherwise make any information from the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content available to anyone other than Subscriber;

(iii) transmit electronically, via e-mail or any other file transfer protocol, any portion of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(iv) create a searchable archive of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(v) use robots or intelligent agents to access, search and/or systematically download or access any portion of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(vi) sell, re-sell, rent, lease, license, sublicense, assign or otherwise transfer the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content or any rights granted under this Agreement;

(vii) use or copy any portion of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content for document delivery, fee-for-service use, or bulk reproduction or distribution of materials in any form, or any substantially similar commercial purpose;

(viii) alter, modify, repackage or adapt the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content;

(ix) make any edits or derivative works with respect to any portion of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content, including any text or graphics;

(x) delete or remove in any form or format, including on a printed article or photocopy, any copyright information or notice contained in any Document; or

(xi) combine any portion of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content with any other material.

Section 8. Our Intellectual Property Rights.

Subscriber agrees that IEEE is the owner of all right, title and interest in and to the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content and/or has the right to license portions of the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content, including all copyright and other intellectual property rights under United States and international laws. Except as expressly permitted by this Agreement, Subscriber may not copy, reproduce, distribute or prepare derivative works based upon the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content, or otherwise infringe IEEE's rights in the IEEE Computer Society Electronic Content.

Section 9. Our Privacy Policy.

The IEEE Computer Society Privacy and Security Guidelines, which can be found at <http://www.computer.org/privacy.htm>, shall apply to Subscriber's use of the CSDL pursuant to this Agreement.

Section 10. Term and Termination of This Agreement.

(a) **Term.** Unless terminated sooner in accordance with subparagraphs (c) or (d) of this Section, this Agreement shall continue in effect for the duration of the calendar year (the "Initial Term") from the Effective Date. The Agreement may be renewed for additional periods (the "Renewal Terms") by Subscriber under the terms and conditions then in effect. The Initial Term and any Renewal Term shall constitute the "Term" of this Agreement.

(b) **Suspension by IEEE Computer Society.** Notwithstanding the terms of subparagraph (a), IEEE Computer Society may suspend Subscriber's access to the CSDL in the event (i) there is any breach or threatened breach of Section 7 by Subscriber; (ii) IEEE Computer Society fails to receive payment when due from Subscriber's credit card issuer; or (iii) Subscriber ceases being an IEEE Computer Society Member. If Subscriber's access to the CSDL is suspended pursuant to subsection (ii) or (iii) above, IEEE Computer Society shall reactivate Subscriber's access to the CSDL if Subscriber arranges the necessary payment or restores appropriate IEEE Computer Society Member status within thirty (30) days after notice of suspension from IEEE Computer Society. Subscriber shall be responsible for all fees due under this Agreement during any period of suspension. If Subscriber fails to arrange the necessary payment or restore IEEE Computer Society

Member status within (30) days after notice from IEEE, IEEE may terminate this Agreement and Subscriber's access to the CSDL in accordance with subparagraph (c) below.

(c) **Termination by IEEE Computer Society.** Without prejudice to IEEE Computer Society's rights, IEEE Computer Society may terminate this Agreement: (i) in the event Subscriber commits a breach of this Agreement which is remediable and not remedied within thirty (30) days of notice from IEEE Computer Society requiring such remedy; (ii) immediately on notice being given by IEEE Computer Society if Subscriber commits any irreparable breach of this Agreement or repeats any breach that has previously been the subject of a notice under subsection (i) above.

(d) **Termination by Subscriber.** Subscriber may terminate this Agreement for any reason and incur no further charges under the Agreement or at any time during the Initial Term or Renewal Term, provided that Subscriber has fulfilled and fully paid all fees due under the then current subscription term. Subscriber may terminate the Agreement by providing notice of termination to IEEE Computer Society in accordance with Section 14, or by not renewing the subscription at the end of the then current subscription term. Termination shall be effective at the conclusion of the subscription period during which IEEE Computer Society receives notice of termination.

(e) **Events Upon Termination.** Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, Subscriber shall immediately cease to receive access to the CSDL.

Section 11. Limited Warranty.

ACCESS AND USE OF THE IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY ELECTRONIC CONTENT IS GRANTED HEREIN ON AN "AS IS" BASIS. IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY MAKES NO WARRANTY TO SUBSCRIBER, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING ALL WARRANTIES OF QUALITY, PERFORMANCE, COMPATIBILITY, MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. Section 12. Limitation of Liability.

(B) IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY UNDERTAKES NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR, AND DISCLAIMS ALL LIABILITY ARISING FROM, ANY INACCURACIES OR DEFECTS IN ANY SCRIPT SOFTWARE, COMMUNICATION LINES, THE INTERNET OR INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDER, SUBSCRIBER'S COMPUTER HARDWARE OR SOFTWARE, OR ANY OTHER SERVICE OR DEVICE USED TO ACCESS THE IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY ELECTRONIC CONTENT, OR TO AUTHENTICATE SUBSCRIBER AS AUTHORIZED TO USE THE CSDL OR ACCESS THE IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY ELECTRONIC CONTENT.

Section 13. No Assignment.

Neither the Agreement nor any part of it may be assigned, sublicensed or otherwise transferred by Subscriber to a third party without IEEE Computer Society's prior written consent.

Section 14. Notice.

From time to time, IEEE Computer Society may have important news or other information that it wishes to communicate to Subscriber via e-mail. This

news and information will be delivered to the Subscriber's e-mail account on file with IEEE Computer Society.

Section 15. Force Majeure.

IEEE Computer Society's performance under this Agreement is subject to interruption and delay due to causes beyond its reasonable control such as acts of God, acts of any government, war or other hostility, civil disorder, the elements, fire, explosion, power failure, equipment failure, industrial or labor dispute, inability to obtain necessary supplies and the like.

Section 16. General Provisions.

This Agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of New York. If any provision of the Agreement is determined by a court to be void, invalid, unenforceable or illegal, the enforceability of the other provisions of the Agreement will not be affected. Failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement will not constitute a waiver of the right to later enforce it. The headings and captions contained in this Agreement are inserted for convenience only and do not constitute a part of this Agreement.
