

CALL FOR PAPERS

Tenth Annual Allerton Conference on Circuit and System Theory

October 4-6, 1972, Allerton House, University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana. Two types of contributed papers are sought to present new results in information processing, communication sciences, control systems, computer science, networks, and system theory. The first kind will be standard papers requiring approximately thirty minutes of presentation. The second will be short papers suitable for presentation in ten minutes or less. This latter type will be to encourage authors to present preliminary results of their work.

For regular papers, a title, fifty-word abstract and five-hundred word summary are required. For short papers, a title, abstract and summary are required. All manuscripts are to be submitted by *August 1, 1972* to: Allerton Conference, c/o Prof. J.B.

1973 IEEE Power Industry Computer Applications Conference

June 4-7, 1973, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Papers are called for in areas of computer application to power system planning, operation, and control. The technical program will include: system planning; system operations; network analysis; dynamics and control; environment; on-line computer systems; and computers for engineering and business systems.

Computer Science Conference
